

Revolution Organics, LP has been required by the Ministry of Environment to issue this notice. We are doing so involuntarily and do not agree with its contents. This matter is subject to legal proceedings and if there is any change required to this Notice as a consequence of the ultimate resolution of those proceedings we will correct this notification.

ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION NOTICE

Application for a Permit under the Provisions of the *Environmental Management Act*.

On June 9, 2016, the Ministry of Environment amended the Organic Matter Recycling Regulation (OMRR) with respect to larger composting facilities. In addition to meeting the requirements of OMRR, existing composting facilities that meet the following criteria now also require a permit:

- process food waste, and
- have the design production capacity to produce 5,000 tonnes or greater of compost/year.

Accordingly, we, Revolution Organics, LP, 19500 – 56th Ave, Surrey, B.C. V3S 6K4, have submitted an application to the director for a permit in relation to the composting facility described below.

The land upon which the facility is situated is:

- Fractional Legal Subdivision 13 of Section 29 Township 15 Range 26 West of the 6th Meridian Kamloops Yale District as shown on Plan of the North West $\frac{1}{4}$ of said Township dated at Ottawa, March 7, 1922;
- Legal Subdivision 14 of Section 29 Township 15 Range 26 West of the 6th Meridian Kamloops Division Yale District;
- District Lot 44 Yale Division Yale District; and
- District Lot 45 Yale Division Yale District except Plans 39375 and 41525;

located at 961 McKay Road, District I, Thompson Nicola Regional District, British Columbia.

The maximum amount of compostable materials accepted at the facility is up to 300,000 wet tonnes of organic matter per year. The maximum rate of Class A compost produced from this facility will be 125,000 tonnes per year. The operating period for this facility will be 24 hours/day, seven days/week. The characteristics of the organic matter for composting are: constituents of organic matter identified in schedule 12 of OMRR primarily consisting of wood chips, tree cuttings, grass clippings, separated food stuffs and compostable paper products. We do NOT process any biosolids or any other constituents of organic matter identified in schedule 12 of OMRR that are not specifically identified in the preceding sentence. The type of treatment applied is turned open windrows.

Any person who may be adversely affected by this existing compost facility and wishes to provide relevant information may, within 30 days after the last date of posting, publishing, service or display, send written comments to the Ministry of Environment. It is preferable to have these comments sent as an e-mail to the Ministry of Environment at env.omrr.reg.reviews@gov.bc.ca . Please indicate your full name, home address, and contact information in the body of your message. This process is covered by the *Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act* (FOIPPA).
