Property owners without insurance or who do not have sufficient insurance must complete the **Right of Entry Permit** to provide the Village and contractors permission to enter and coordinate clean-up of their property.

For residents with adequate property insurance, your insurance company will hire a contractor to provide the debris removal services.

For those without insurance or who do not have sufficient insurance, debris removal will be managed by Lytton's contractor to support this effort in a consistent manner.

Province adds support for Lytton's recovery
