

## ADVANCE ELECTOR REGISTRATION

PUBLIC NOTICE is hereby given that advance registration for the Village of Lytton General Election will close on August 23, 2022.

### Are you eligible to vote in the Lytton General Election on October 15, 2022?

### Is your name on the current list of electors?

The Village of Lytton will be using the Provincial List of Voters for Resident Electors for the 2022 General Election. To check if you are on the list, inquire with Elections BC by visiting [elections.bc.ca/voting/register-to-vote](https://elections.bc.ca/voting/register-to-vote) or call 1-800-661-8683 (Monday to Friday, 8:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. PST).

### If you are not on the list, you can register in person on Advance or General Voting Day.

The Village of Lytton will maintain a list of Non-Resident Property Electors. You may register by contacting [elections@lytton.ca](mailto:elections@lytton.ca) or visiting Lytton Municipal Hall during regular office hours, Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. at Old Towne Inne, Cabin #2, 47555 Trans-Canada Highway, Boston Bar, V0K 1C0.

Advance Elector Registration for Non-Resident Property Electors will be accepted until August 23, 2022. Registrations cannot be accepted during the period of August 24 to October 17 but will be accepted on voting days.

## Elector Qualifications

### Resident Electors

- 18 years of age or older on General Voting Day;
- A Canadian citizen;
- A resident of British Columbia for at least six months immediately before the day of registration;
- A resident of the Village of Lytton; and
- Not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

### Non-Resident Property Elector

- 18 years of age or older on General Voting Day;
- A Canadian citizen;
- A resident of British Columbia for at least six months before the day of registration;
- A registered owner of real property in the Village of Lytton for at least 30 days before the day of registration;
- The only persons who are registered owners of the property, either as joint tenants or tenants in common, are individuals who are not holding the property in trust for a corporation, or another trust;
- Not entitled to register as a resident elector; and
- Not disqualified under the *Local Government Act* or any other enactment from voting and not otherwise disqualified by law.

If there is more than one registered owner of the property, only one of those individuals may, with the written consent of the majority of the owners, register as a Non-Resident Property Elector.

## List of Electors

Beginning on August 30 until the close of general voting for the election on October 15, a copy of the list of registered electors will be available for public inspection, at Lytton Municipal Hall during regular office hours, Monday to Friday from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m., excluding statutory holidays, at Old Towne Inne, Cabin #2, 47555 Trans-Canada Highway, Boston Bar, V0K 1C0.

Before inspecting the list, a person must sign a statement that they will not inspect the list, make copies, or use the information included in the list except for the purposes of Part 3 – Electors and Elections of the *Local Government Act*.

## Request to omit or obscure

An elector may request that their address or other personal information about them be omitted from or obscured on the list of electors. The elector must contact the Chief Election Officer to make this request at [elections@lytton.ca](mailto:elections@lytton.ca).

## Objection to registration of an elector

An objection to the registration of a person whose name appears on the list of registered electors may be made in accordance with the *Local Government Act* until 4:00 p.m. on September 9. An objection must be in writing and an objection may only be made by a person entitled to be registered as an elector of the Village of Lytton and only on the basis that a person whose name appears on the list of electors has died or is not qualified to register as an elector of the Village of Lytton.
